### **About YWCA San Antonio:**

YWCA Women of Influence is YWCA San Antonio's signature recognition event and largest fundraiser. \* **YWCA RESET** (Re-engagement for Self-Sufficiency, Empowerment and Transformation) is a component of YWCA Economic Empowerment. It serves young women (aged 16-25) who are "disconnected" from school, training or employment who need academic, career and support services to become economically self-sufficient, safe and productive members of society. YWCA RESET helps them access education, training and employment so they can support themselves and their families and break the cycle of poverty. YWCA RESET trains participants to become certified community health workers ("promotoras"), providing marginalized communities with education about and access to vaccinations, health services, and screenings for health conditions that disproportionately impact them.

### **WOMEN'S LIVE AND LEARN CENTER:**

In 2021, YWCA announced its intention to significantly expand service offerings through acquisition of a facility to house its Women's Live and Learn Center. The facility will house services focusing on removing barriers for women to become self-sufficient, contributing members of the community.

The St. Andrew's Convent, a 25-unit residential building with office space located on 9 acres, will provide: housing, job training, health and mental health services, child care, and case management to "disconnected" women ages 17-25, including those aging out of the foster system. The goal will be to help young women, particularly women of color, graduate to homeownership, earn a living wage, and live independently.



As a women's educational campus, the Women's Live and Learn Center will be a symbol of hope to women and to San Antonio's West Side, where women can achieve their dreams of independence. The Center will afford residents key supportive services such as case management, childcare, healthcare, mental health counseling, nutrition, financial literacy and job training and education. Master planning efforts are being initiated to plan for the redevelopment of the rest of the campus, which could include expanded service facilities, entrepreneurship/maker space, additional child care, and a community garden.

The Women's Live and Learn Center will offer young women the opportunity to live on-campus for up to four years and will provide the following services:

- Job training/certification
- Child Care
- Individualized Life Plans/life coaching
- Entrepreneurship classes
- Preventive health/wellness/mental health
- Financial literacy
- Homeownership training
